Item third. To my son John Rau I give the lower
lower part of my plantation, containing the dwelling house,
and Grist Mill, bounded as follows. Beginning at Negley's
line in the west end of my lane, and running east with the
lane, so as to cross the brick and run up to William Morton's
line, dividing equally the large garden lot in front of the Mill.
Item fourth.

To my son John Rau I give the remainder
or upper part of my plantation, also my Theological Library
left me by my son Thomas David, except Henry's
commentary and Davies' Sermons, which I have given to Da-
vid Edith.

Item fourth. To my daughter Sarah Edith I give
her two furnished beds, and her own. She is to have one room
which is to be the choice of Miss Cott. This is to have her Bed-
room during Sabbath and Feast Days and Beoggy. She is also
to have Twenty pounds, paid annually to be taken out before
my wife gets her third. But if the whole sum of $\$$ 1000 should
fall short of the hundred pounds, then she is to have one
fifth part. But in case she should leave this her present
home, then she is to have one fourth of the Stock, but not to
 exceed Twenty five. She is to have privilege, so long as she may
remain at the Old Homestead of rising and occupying two
rooms, the east room upstairs and the little North side room
downstairs. She is also to use and occupy her little garden
and trees, at the North End of the house, and one sixth part
of the large garden or lot in front of the Mill. Mr. James
Baymond is to pay, being in view of the value of his lands, four
hundred dollars, One hundred annually for fifteen years, and
John Rau One hundred, and this is to be supported as one of the
family.

Item fifth. To my two sons John Rau and James Rau
I give all the remainder of my personal property, which
James may not be sold as my inheritance is so immediately
as not to make it necessary.

Item sixth. To my wife I give her lifetime interest in
my estate, to be used or occupied by her joint with myself, during
and no conveyance made in this will is to be construed as to
impair in any way, the present Mill estate.

And now I declare
this division of my estate to be my last will and testament
and I authorize and appoint my son John Rau to act and
serve as my executor. Witness my hand and seal this the
twentieth day of July Eighteen hundred and Sixty Four.

To the Wm. H. Allison Estate of Delaware County

The foregoing statement presents the Settlement of the account of William H. Allison as Administrator of Joseph Clark deceased, and shows a balance in the hands of the Administrator of Fifteen Thousand, Nine Hundred and Fifty-four Dollars and Sixty-five Cents.

It is proper to state that the bond on A. Owens for \$3400, and that on Rocco Totaro for \$3500, are subjects of litigation and though charged to the Administrator as part of the debts such charge ought to affect him only to the extent of his security upon them. I have not estimated interest upon these bonds. Not doubting that the Court may present will have to be remodeled to adapt it to the standing of the Administrator, in relation to the estate as developed upon the determination of the cause pending in relation to these, and other matters connected with the estate. It is further further to state that all the debts charged to the Administrator are suspended by the stay law, but none of same having been returned by him, they are all liable to him as a master of Courts. It will become the duty of the Commissioner, in making future settlements, to go into an investigation the worth of the debts actually received, and to base a statement upon the result of that investigation, instead of following the usual course of adopting the balance reported in this statement as the proper one with which to charge the Administrator. I have not allowed Commissions on the amount of the debts on Owens and Totaro & others, which amount to be realized from these debts shall be ascertained. Commissions should then be allowed. Interest is charged to the time of the finalization of the Administrator for five days from the principal to the close of the statement, with a view to facilitate future calculations. No one of the bonds interest was suspended during the war by the insolvent, I am informed this was the case with the bond on Alessandro and perhaps other. Show credite to the Administrator with the interest at 6% to
