First of all I give my Executor as it shall please the Lord to send my business in this world to have my body plainly but decently buried by the side of my late beloved husband George Caton and have stones such as mark his grave placed to mine, and then I want my funeral expenses paid off, and then, Secondly, I give to my nephew John Caddall the balance of what may be due to me from the estate of my late husband George Caton, and which now remain in his, and Joseph Caton's hands as Executors of George Caton deceased. Thirdly, I hold a land in Raleigh Monroe Stafford, now in J. Caddall's hands, upon which there is about two hundred dollars due, besides the interest. This land I give to my brother in law James Stafford, Fourthly and lastly, I give the balance of my estate of my kind and affection to my friend and relative Harrison Vickers, and finally constitute & appoint John Caddall my Executor of this my last will and Testament.
