J. Moses B. Floyd of the County of Pulaski and State of
Virginia, do make certain and declare this instrument of writing
to be my last will and Testament.
1st I give to my wife Martha who has been to me most kind

and affectionate, any one room in my dwelling house which
she may wish to be tenet and possessed by her during her nat-
ural life, I also give to her my buggy and my best three year
Colts and one good bed and bedding complete and in addition to
these I require my Son Joseph B. Floyd and my son in law
John A. Baue to furnish her with every thing necessary & proper
to enable her to live well and comfortable.

2nd I give to my grand Son William R. Harris my gold
watch.

3rd I have heretofore given to my Son in Law Robert P. Harris
and his wife Eleanor a tract of land lying near where Rogers
old Church formerly stood together with a good deal of personal
property the several items of which with the value I have given
to them may be seen by referring to my account Book. The gifts I
now make and confirm and cause and make void the accounts
and I have given them in addition thereto a bond I hold on Charles
I have for a bond forty five dollars.

4th The balance of my estate both real and personal I dispose
of as follows. I give one half thereof to my Son Joseph B. Floyd
and the other half I give to my Son in Law John A. Baue
and his wife (my daughter) Elizabeth. But I require of them to
pay off all my just debts and funeral expenses and in order
to enable them to an equitable division my Son Joseph must
pay off the bond I hold on him and John A. Baue must
pay off or charge himself with seven hundred and eighteen dol-
lars the amount charged to him in my account Book. I
also require them to furnish Mrs. Mathe Baskin with a good
new saddle and a good bed and bedding complete.

5th And Lastly I constitute and appoint John A. Baue
and Joseph B. Floyd my Executors of this my last will and
Testament, and my confidant in this is such that I do not
need the Court's require of them security, as such and asking
as executors I wish them to have an inventory and appraisement
made of my personal Estate but no sale of anything need be
made without my signature and seal this 31st day of May 1865
