I, Francis Godby of the County of Pulaski and State of Virginia, considering the uncertainty of this life and transitory Godby, do make and publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner, and to the following effect, to wit:

Desiring to make provision for the support of all my property, real and personal of which I am possessed, I hereby give and bequeath, after all my funeral expenses shall have been paid together with my just debts (if any) to my son Reuben Godby, all of my property, both real and personal, with the usufruct and right to use and request that my beloved wife Rhoda should during her natural life, hold and enjoy in her right of all my property bequeathed above, and at her death to become the property of my son Reuben Godby.

The object of the testator in making this bequest to my said son Reuben Godby, is in consideration of the great trouble and expense already incurred in the maintenance of the testator and his beloved wife Rhoda, and to forever release my son Reuben Godby from the payment of any sum, or sum of money that may hereafter be claimed by any of my children as due and coming to them by any former bequest of mine.

The foregoing bequest is subject to the right of my beloved wife Rhoda, as already mentioned, and by will and desire is that my executor shall assign her dower in my land, including the dwelling house.

My son Reuben Godby Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby executing all former wills by me at any time made.

To the Honorable Court of Pulaski County
 The foregoing presents a settlement of James A. Walker as Administrator of the Estate of Thomas Page, deceased, and shows a balance due from the Adm^r of dollar thousand four hundred and thirty seven dollars and eighty four cents. It is proper to state that this balance is composed principally of a large debt amounting to \$1268.33 upon which the Adm^r has brought suit, but is not secured so that anything will be realized upon it. Whenever this suit is determined, if nothing is realized upon it, the Adm^r should have credit for this debt. And in any event should be credited for any part of which he may be unable to collect. The said balance is further composed of another debt of about \$148, for which a judgment has been obtained, and which will probably be collected, if however the Adm^r should be unable to collect the last mentioned debt, he should be credited with the amount of it in his final settlement. I have credited the Adm^r in this settlement with the balance on the \$1000 note charged to and forming a part of the balance reported against him in the last settlement, it having been ascertained, since that settlement by the result of a suit brought upon that bond, that nothing can be realized upon it.
