If upon the valuation as above directed by my Executors it be ascertained that my sons, Mrs. C. & Mrs. D. Murchie have received more than their proportion of my estate, in that event my will & desire is that they be not required to pay over the balance so found against them until four years have elapsed and then only one half of said amount so found and the balance in two years thereafter without interest.

I direct my Executors to leave an ample & full supply of every necessary & comfort for my family during one year from my decease free of charge.

I appoint & name to Murchie James W. Murchie and Thos Kemmell Executors of the my last Will & Testament.
