Will
I, Lorenzo Eaton of the County of Pulaski and State of Virginia
being of sound mind, but weak in body from a disease from which
I have but very little hope of ever recovering, have thought it
best to make some disposition of the earthly goods which the
Lord in his good providence has blessed me with. I therefore make
ordain and declare this instrument of writing to be my last Will
and Testament

First - I direct that all my just debts, which are but few in
number and none of magnitude be paid of by my Executors.
Secondly, I give to my wife Kessiah Eaton, who has always
been good and kind to me, one Negro Man named John
Black, and one Negro woman named Charlott Black
and her child named Lucinda Ann, her bed of Room,
called Ned and Polly, two Beds & Bedsteads with full
furniture, one set of Chairs One Cupboard and Cupboard ware
and one Cooking Stove with its fixtures, also four hundred
dollars in money, all of which is to be bona-fide here-
without reserve or limitation.

Thirdly, I give to my aged Father Two hundred dollars
in money, not that he is likely to need it, but as a token
of my love and affection for him.

Fourthly, I give to my brother Joseph Eaton, David
Eaton, Edward Eaton, and my sister Elizabeth Williams and

or Pearly in the County of Montgomery containing about
fifteen hundred acres, this land was deeded to me by Lorenzo
D. Kirk, and the title is some what doubtful, they are therefore
to take all my right to it, and hold it if they can, but should
let they lose it, they are to have nothing from my Estate in
lieu of it, nor are they to have any recourse on Kirk or his
heirs for it.

Fifthly, As the four part of this will I have given to my
wife three Slaves John Black, Charlott Black & her child
Lucinda Ann, the balance of my Slaves I want appraised
and sold by my Executors at private sale, to such persons as
they, the Slaves, may each respectively select, provided the selected
person will give the amount of the appraisement, and provided
further that no mother and her child are to be separated
in making sale of these Slaves my Executors are to give a
credit of Twelve months, the purchasers giving bond with
good security.

Sixthly, I direct that my tract of land lying in ^{the County of} Pulaski
and well known as the Ridge place be sold at public
auction, on a credit of, say, six Twelve and Eighteen
months, and I own the half of a hundred acre tract
of land in Giles County which lies on the North side
of Walker's Big Mountain, the amount to be paid on a
like credit, but in each case the purchaser is to give
bond with good personal security and the title retained
until the purchase money is fully paid. I further
direct that all my goods and chattels, Stock and
farming utensils not specifically directed, be sold
according to law, together with two shares of Stock in
the Giles and Pulaski Turnpike Company, also half of
my wheat and, Bacon, there being much more than my wife
will need, the other half must be left for the use of the family.

Seventhly, I give to my brother Edward Eaton the tract
of land on which I now live, lying and being in the Coun-
ty of Pulaski on Neck Road, containing about Two hun-
dred and fifty Acres, for which he is to pay thirty five hun-
dred Dollars, at the end of five years from the time of
my decease or at the death of my wife, just as the one or
the other time may suit him best, four hundred Dollars
of which is to be paid to the children of my deceased sister
Nancy Leach, taken collectively their names are not now
recollected, four hundred dollars to the children of my
deceased brother Richard Eaton, taken collectively, William
F. Eaton only excepted, he is to have no part therein -
Five hundred Dollars to Elizabeth Eaton, and

Eaton to four hundred Dollars to Samu Eaton, and four hundred dollars to Elizabeth Williams, and four hundred dollars to Susan Hammon and four hundred dollars to John Scott and the said Edward Eaton is further required to take care of, and support my wife during her natural life and he is to let her have a Room to herself in the old mansion house, and if she requires it, the Kitchen also is to be for her use.

Lastly, I direct that all the money, that my Executors may collect from my debtors, or that may come into their hands from the sale of the property devised by me to be sold, after paying off specific legacies, be equally divided amongst my brothers and sisters, and my brothers in law and sisters in law being after named (Nancy Scott children and part of Richard Eatons children as hereinafter named to be also taken into the account), To wit: Joseph Eaton John Eaton, Edward Eaton David Eaton, Samu Eaton John Scott, Elizabeth Williams Susan Hammon, and the children of Nancy Scott collectively to be taken as one legatee, and the children of Richard Eaton, William F Eaton excepted) collectively, to be counted as one legatee the names of Richard Eatons children to whom this devise is made are Wiley S Eaton Mary Jo Williamson Joseph R Eatons Polina Eaton Emeline L Eaton and Lucina Eaton, the names of Nancy Scotts children are not known.

Ninthly, My Executors will find amongst my papers a bond on Samuel Scott for about thirty Dollars, this bond is to be canceled, and given up to him Tenth and Lastly, I constitute and appoint John Leadballe and Joseph Eaton my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

Virginia. At a Court held for the County of Pulaski the 8th day of April 1838.

The last Will and Testament, and also a Codicil, thereto, of Crozier Eaton deceased, was presented in Court, proven by John S Howe and John M Hoge subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John Leadballe and Joseph Eaton the Executors named in said Will and together with Edward Halson John S Howe John Tiedinger and Charles Owens as their Securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty five thousand dollars with such conditions as the law requires, and having qualified according to law, certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form.

In Court I, John W. Carnahan of the County of Pulaski and State of Virginia do make certain and declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament.

To my daughter, Isabella E. Carnahan I will and bequeath the sum of Fifty thousand Dollars (\$50,000) also to my daughter Mary Ann Carnahan the like sum of fifteen thousand Dollars (\$1500) I also bequeath to my daughter Isabella E. Carnahan, & Mary Ann Carnahan jointly all my personal property, money & debts, that may be due me at my death.

It is my wish and desire that my Executors shall sell my real estate, on a credit of from one to four years, or for less, as they may judge most advisable, and to pay out of the proceeds of the sale, the above mentioned legacies and the residue, I desire shall be divided equally between my sons Thos. S. William B. Samuel W. & John W. Carnahan.

I hereby constitute and appoint Thos. S. Carnahan Samuel W. Carnahan Executors of this my last Will & Testament who it is my wish shall administer without giving security. In witness of all things herein contained I have set my hand and seal this 20th day of Jan 1838.
