2d At the decease of my wife the said Mary Rankin it is my will and desire that all of my slaves viz: Jacob, Madison, and their four children, Mary, and Mary, John, & George, and their future increase, be emancipated, and settled in some free State, and for the purpose of placing the said negroes in as comfortable a condition as possible I desire that at the decease of my wife Mary Rankin the whole of my lands & personal property that may be sold at her death be sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, and that one third of the proceeds thereof be left in the hands of my Executors (hereafter to be appointed) to defray the expenses of removal and settlement of the said negroes, hereby directing that the residue left after such removal and defraying all the necessary expenses thereof be laid out in land by my Executors for their joint use and benefit.

3d I give and bequeath to James W. Meriwether his heirs & the remaining two thirds of the proceeds of the said sale of my estate.

4th And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my friend John L. Haddatt, & Tyler Ann Proctor, Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.
