Perish, I desire not doubt that all my just debts be paid, and for this purpose I authorize and empower my Executors, hereinafter named, to borrow as much money as may be necessary for that purpose. The money so borrowed by them to be repaid out of the profits of my estate as hereinafter directed.

Secondly, I desire and direct, that my Estate shall be kept together and managed to the best advantage by my executors until it shall become necessary by the marriage or descent of full age of some or one of my children for a distribution thereof on the happening of either of which events, I desire

divided equally among all my children.
Thirdly, My wife being now pregnant, and likely in a few months
to give birth to a child; in the event of that child living, I desire
and direct, that it shall share my Estate equally, with my other
children: in the event however ^{of its dying before it} ~~of its dying~~ ^{before it} ~~dies~~ ^{arrives at} ~~before it~~ ^{careful} ~~before it~~ ^{age}, I bequeath the portion which it may have
received or be entitled to, under my Will, to such of my other
children or their heirs as may survive it.

Fourthly, My Wife having signified her intention and wish to depend upon the estate, and to take that wholly care of my children which they need, I desire and direct that she be, permitted to do so, and that a comfortable provision be made for her out of my estate, during her widowhood.

And, I desire and declare that the profits of my estate until a distribution thereof, shall be applied, so far as may be necessary, to the repayment of any money borrowed by my Executors, for the purpose of paying my debts, as hereinbefore directed.

Sixthly. I desire and direct that my son David L. Pierce shall be liberally and thoroughly educated and that the expense of educating all my children shall be paid out of my estate.

Scrubably, I desir and direct that my Executors shall have the new dwelling house commenced by me properly finished and completed. Explicitly, Having received of Charles and Anthony Evans the full amount of the five hundred money paid by me for the plantation on which they live, called the Cat Hole, and not having made them a Deed for it, I hereby, authorize, empower and direct my Executors to execute a Deed, conveying all my interests in that tract of land to them.

Now Assembly, I affirm my brother William Pierce and my friend Edwin Watson, and William A. Stuart, Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.
