Be: The Maids of God: I Elizabeth Hoge being weak in body but of sound & disposing mind and memory do make and declare this in full of my last will & testament. I do say John Mathew Hoge having received four hundred dollars now in his hands of the money willed to me by my sister Rebecca Hoge which it was and still is my intention that he keep I hereby will and bequeath to my said son John Mathew Hoge the said four hundred dollars now in his hands with any interest that may be due thereon the remainder of my estate I will & direct to be disposed of in the manner following To wit: I direct that my executors hereafter named collect all other moneys due to me and after paying all my just debts and funeral expenses pay to my daughters Matilda Lloyd, Rebecca Williams to Nancy B. Hoge & Margaret Hickman or their representatives one hundred dollars each to be paid one year after my death to my three Grand Children Edward, Thomas Hoge Mary Elizabeth Hoge & Margaret Virginia Hoge Children of Moses H. Hoge five & upwards fifty dollars each to be received by their guardian and by him loaned out at interest for their benefit untill they shall severally arrive at the age of 21 years & then to be paid to them as soon as they come at said age to be paid to each one as soon as he or she arrives at the age of 21 years or to his or hers if dead; all other moneys or bonds due after paying the legacies I direct to be divided equally between my three sons George D. Hoge Moses H. Hoge & John M. Hoge and I direct I may have by the will of my late husband John Hoge in the said last mentioned will & as bequeath to the same persons & to whom the negroes left to me for life and left by said will to be divided & disposed of in the same manner.

I nominate, constitute and appoint my three sons George D. Hoge Moses H. Hoge & John M. Hoge as my executors. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th day of March 1851 Teste Elizabeth Hoge (Seal)

I Elizabeth Hoge of the County of Pulaski & State of Virginia being in a low state of health but of sound mind & memory make and constitute this my last will & testament which will bear date the 6th day of March 1851 that is to say that in said will where I direct that after paying specific debts I want that all other moneys due after paying the legacies to be divided between my three sons George D. Hoge Moses H. Hoge & John M. Hoge now devise & direct Eliza Lloyd Jane B. Peter & the two children of Rachel Thomas and be made equal with my sons in said division above alluded that is Rachel H. Peter & John M. Thomas have one 6th part thereof & witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 20th day of Sept 1851 (Elizabeth Hoge Seal)
