of my estate, I direct that he pay unto to my Executors to be held
by them upon trust two hundred dollars, and that he pay unto his
Sisters, Jane Bickman, Matilda, Mary, Henry B. Hager, and Margaret
R. Bickman each respectively two hundred dollars in three equal
annual instalments, the first instalment to be paid within twelve
months from the time of my decease.

6th I devise to my daughter Margaret R. Bickman a tract of land
lying on the South side of, and adjoining my other lands and known
by the name of the white glades, and containing by survey three
hundred and twenty acres to her and her heirs forever.

7th I devise to my son John M. Hager two thirds of my lands lying in
the County of Bulake, "not otherwise devised" and to the death
of his mother the remaining third part to him and his heirs for
ever. But as a part of the trust devised to Moses M. Hager is included
in what is called my Louisiana tract, I direct that part so included
to be equally divided between the said Moses M. Hager and John M.
Hager, so that Moses M. Hager may get the east side of John M.
Hager's tract, and the west side of the piece of land aforesaid.

8th I devise to my two grand children John M. Thomas and Rachel M.
Bick what I have given them by an indentment of a bond for
their benefit, which bond is for my part of the price of a lot in
the town of Blacksburg which was sold unto John Speckard, also
my part and interest in a house and lot in the town of Blacksburg
and in a tract of land lying on the waters of Roanoke, both
now held jointly by myself and late William Thomas which
devise, is to them and their heirs forever.

Having heretofore made considerable management and
my during my life, make more unto my daughter's Eliza M.
Long, Jane Bickman, Matilda, Mary, Rebecca M. F. Tyne, Mary R.
Hager and Margaret R. Bickman, but unto some minor part
to others of them, I therefore direct that their accounts be com-
pared and those that are short be brought up and made equal
out of my personal estate with the one that has received the
most and what Eliza M. Long's account lacks of being equal to the one
who has received the most shall be held or paid over to my
Executors hereafter named, to be held by them in trust, and in
adjusting this matter reference shall be had to my account book
kept by myself.

9th I devise to my Executors hereafter named "Upon Trust,
and to my daughter Jane Bickman, Matilda, Mary, Rebecca
M. F. Tyne, Henry B. Hager, and Margaret R. Bickman my
tract of land in the County of Weythe adjoining the lands of David
Crawford George Walton, also my interest in a tract of

John Hager of the County of Bulake and State of Virginia, at
this time being of a disposing mind and memory, and reflecting
on the uncertainty of all human events, do make, ordain, and
declare this testament to be my last Will and Testament, hereby
revoking all former ones made by me;
First he commends my soul to God who gave it, and my body to
the earth, there to be decently buried.

2nd I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid off.

3rd I devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hager one third part
of the plantation I now live upon for and during her natural life
together with so much of my household furniture as she may
wish to keep; also all my negroes during her natural life.

4th Having in the month of May 1837 established my son George
Hager in the mercantile business with a stock of goods amount-
ing in value to the sum of three thousand dollars, I have given
him, and thereby satisfy and confirm that gift, and
absolve him from all obligations to pay for them.

5th I give to my son Moses M. Hager my tract of land on
the Roanoke River, between the waters of the Roanoke and
the James, and held jointly by myself and late William Thomas
