Thirdly I direct that my Daughter Louisa Robinson have the tract of land she now lives on lying on Little Water Creek containing about Eighty five acres by her paying Ten Dollars and fifty cents per acre and the balance of her share to be paid in money. Fourthly I direct that five Hundred Dollars be equally divided between Robert Hicks Children which they had by his wife Catharine my Daughter.
