Well I David Clayton of Putnam County as hereby make my last will and Testament in the following manner that is to say. First, I give, hereafter give to my son in law Gordon C. Kent all the property I design to give him I give & bequeath to my Grandson David C. Kent Three Thousand Dollars. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son in law David McCarroll the lands now in his possession, and which were purchased by one of Gordon C. Kent, I also give and bequeath to him the lands now in his possession to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my two Grand Children David McCarroll and Sarah McCarroll One Thousand Dollars each.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my three sons Joseph Clayton, Gordon Clayton and James M. Clayton all the residue of my property, real and personal, of every kind and description to be equally divided between them, I having however heretofore conveyed to my son Joseph the House and tract of land, it is my intention that in the division of my property among my three sons, its value shall be considered and brought into the estimate so that they shall be made equal, to hold the same to them and their heirs forever.

I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph Clayton, David McCarroll and David Clayton Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made, and it is my desire, that my said Executors shall not be required to give Security.
