Will of John Black being in infirm health and in extreme old age but of sound mind do make this my last will and testament in which after my death I give and bequeath to my children Sally Jones the heirs of Robert Black James Black Martha Warden John Black William Black the sum of one dollar each and to Hugh Black I give and bequeath all the property I may then have after paying all my just debts and I also give and bequeath to him all my lands in Pulaski County so lying on the waters of Indian Branch and bounded by the lands of the heirs of James Allison by the lands of Francis Allison & James Hays to be his to keep and to perform in testimony to which I in the presence of these witnesses acknowledge this my will and deed made and signed on the 15th day of April 1850.
