Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give & direct that all my just debts & expenses be paid  
Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth during her natural life  
all that portion of my land or tract of land purchased from William Camp-  
bell lying on the North Eastern side of the W. G. Game Rail Road and at the  
death of my son Robert, and in the event of his death before my wife to  
his children to equally divide between them

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my son Davis & William the tract of land purchased  
of Robert Sprout, Henry Coffey & Henry Hamel the land bought of the  
late Sprout being part of Ranchins land; to be divided according to a  
fence now standing, and agreed upon between my son William & my self  
Beginning on the line between Andrew Ranchin & myself and running nearly  
a south course with same fence to a Cucumber, I thence with it from nearly  
an eastern course to a black oak, and thence south east with said fence to  
a corner of same, thence with said fence to a corner of same, thence  
nearly an eastern course leaving the fence to a white oak & black oak on
