the City of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania  
a widow being of sound and disposing mind  
and memory do make and declare this my  
last will and Testament in manner following  
that is to say:

whereas, my son Thomas Morris  
is indebted to me in the sum of Ten Thousand  
Dollars for which sum I hold his promissory  
Note. I give and bequeath one moiety  
or equal half part of the said debt to my son Henry  
Morris his Executrix, Administrator and assigns  
and upon the payment of one half of the principal  
part of the said debt by my said son Thomas  
Morris or his Representatives to my said son  
Henry Morris or his Representatives, then I  
will and direct that my said son Thomas Mor-  
ris shall be released from the payment of the  
other moiety or half part of the said debt and  
all the interest, and the said note shall on  
such payment being made, be cancelled.

I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter  
Mary Marshall Two Hundred Dollars Twenty  
Dollars, Currency.

I give and bequeath to my son  
Henry Morris my large Silver Coffee pot and  
largest Silver waiter.

I do hereby nominate and  
remainder of my estate and property both real  
and personal whatsoever and wheresoever I give  
devise and bequeath to my Daughter Maria Maria  
her Heirs Executors Administrators and assigns.  
This devise and bequest to include not only all the  
estate and property of which I am now seized  
or possessed but also all such I may hereafter

acquire at the time of my death and is intended for my  
Daughter sole and separate use notwithstanding  
her marriage.

I appoint and constitute my sons  
Thomas Morris and Henry Morris to be the Executors  
of this my will.

Lasty I revoke all wills by me  
herebefore made and declare this to be my last will  
and Testament. I sign my hand and seal this  
Twenty second day of October in the year of our  
Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and twenty four  
Signed sealed declared and published by the Testator Mary Morris  
as and for her last will and Testa-  
ment in our presence who at  
her request in her presence and  
in the presence of each other have  
subscribed the same as witness  
John Beachley - f<sup>o</sup> Feb<sup>15</sup>  
Robt. B. Taylor aff<sup>d</sup>

Philadelphia, February 15 1827 Then personally appeared John  
Beachley and Robert B. Taylor the subscribing wit-  
nesses to the within will and being duly sworn accord-

hear Mary Morris the Testatrix in said will make  
sign and publish and declare the same as and  
for her last will and Testament and that by the do-  
ing thereof she was of sound mind memory and  
understanding to the best of their knowledge and  
belief.
