Dickman, George D. Hagen, Moses H. Hagen and John M. Hagen.

16<sup>th</sup> I direct that the lands, property, money, bills or notes devised to my Executors hereafter named shall be held by them, or the acting or surviving part of them upon Trust, for the necessary support of my daughter Eliza S. Long, to be paid by them for said purposes, and in such proportions as they may think necessary from time to time, and if they may think it advisable, sell the lands which are herein devised to them, and on receipt of the purchase money, convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers, holding the money in Trust for the purposes aforesaid, and they are hereby authorized when they may think proper, to make sale of any property which may come into their hands by virtue of the devises aforesaid, or collect monies due to them by virtue of the devises aforesaid and to loan out said monies on interest when they may think it advisable, to do so, so as that the monies be kept safe, and ready for the purposes aforesaid, and if the whole of the funds now placed in the hands of my Executors as aforesaid, for the purposes aforesaid be not all paid out & disposed of for the purposes aforesaid during the natural life of my daughter Eliza S. Long, then the residue to be paid unto her children & viz: Margaret James Long, John Montgomery Long, James Thomas Long and Ann Elizabeth Long, and if my said daughter Eliza S. Long should hereafter have any more children they are to come in equal with the above named children.

17<sup>th</sup> And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint Moses H. Hagen, John M. Hagen and Moses S. Long, my Executors of this my last will and Testament.

In obedience of an order of the County Court of Bulash County made at the June term 1847 appointing us Commissioners to settle and the account of Samuel Ingram Guardian of Margaret Deavor we hereby leave to submit the foregoing statement and account. It will be seen that the lands of John Deavor dec'd were rented several years before Samuel Ingram was appointed Guardian of Margaret Deavor which rents were received by Samuel Ingram and charged to his own account after allowing him 5 per cent on such receipts, as also the sum of \$12.00 balance of proceeds of the personal estate of John Deavor dec'd which amt is also charged in account to the Guardian, as also the rents received by him from the year 1836 to the year 1847 inclusive which he is allowed 5 per cent Commission on each annual receipt and charged 5 per cent interest on each annual balance and allowing him credits for disbursements in each year which statement leaves in the hands of Samuel Ingram the sum of \$761.02 1/2. It is proper to remark that the Guardian has made no charge for extra trouble or for boardings & clothing all his vouchers are for necessities purchased by others, he is charged for 3 year boardings washing and clothing by Jacob Deavor dec'd. It is also proper to state that Simon Bayson was introduced as a witness concerning the rents of the lands which was taken on oath and is marked (30) all of which is respectfully submitted
