Thomas Leyd of Putashi County do make this my last  
will and Testament in manner following, I direct my  
Execution hereafter named, to pay my debts, I now owe,  
and my first desire is for my wife Sally Leyd to receive  
a comfortable living on the domain where she now lives  
together with my son David Leyd, which thereafter will  
make provision for, and should my son David Leyd  
depart this life before his mother, without any heir,  
in this event my wife Sally Leyd is hereby authorized  
to make such a disposition of my real as well as my  
personal Estate as she may think proper, I now make  
the following disposition of my real as well as my  
personal Estate, I give to my son David Leyd the  
following plantations and parcels of land, to wit, the  
plantation known as the Big place, which lies  
immediately above, both of which is now called the Gun-  
barrel Bottom, and was originally called Mahanaion  
in the old patent for nine hundred acres granted  
to Garrett Givens, also all of the several tracts and parcels  
of land that I claim adjoining said nine hundred acres  
on the north and east side of New River, together with  
several more plantations, with their fixtures and  
appurtenances thereto belonging amounting in the whole  
to about four thousand acres, or less, this amount  
includes the said nine hundred acres, also the lands  
that I claim on the back side of New River opposite  
the Black bottom and that on the west side including  
Egypt, together with the several plantations and ap-  
partments thereto belonging amounting in the whole to  
about two thousand and fifteen acres, be the same  
more or less, I give unto my son David Leyd my interest  
in these lands lots and claimis by Thomas and

and the other two hundred and seventy acres, adjoining and  
below the above tract, which is situated in the County of  
Brazier, on Christians fork of Brush Creek, I give unto my son  
David Leyd the following negro slaves to wit, Moses and  
wife, Honah and three of her sons, to wit, Allen, Stephen  
and Leesty, also Stephens wife, Mariah and son Henry, also  
Stump Jim and his wife, Sarah and five children to wit,  
Edward, Eliza, Meary and Susanna and Felicia, also Isaac  
and his wife, Lydia, and three children to wit, Lucia,  
Leah and William, also the following children of  
man Charles, by his first wife, to wit, Abram, Mathew,  
Lucy and Joseph, also big Edward, also big Jim, also  
Daniel, also Mariah and two of her children to wit, Sam-  
pson and Minard, also Phaney and five of her children  
to wit, Rachel, Samuel, Tom, Heald and Ellen, I give  
unto my son David Leyd all my stock of cattle and  
horses as above, that is now on the Gunbarrel Bottom and  
Egypt, and including a flock of sheep that is now at Cecil  
place, also all of my gear and farming utensils, I  
give unto my son in law Gordon Kent, who married my  
daughter Lucinda, Leyd, the following tracts or parcels  
of land situated in the said County of Putashi, on the  
waters of Brush Creek and falling Spring waters of New River  
to wit Cecil place, four hundred acres, forty three acres,  
also thirty six acres adjoining the same, on the north and  
east sides, also fourteen acres adjoining said 443 acres  
and James Haze, also one thousand four hundred and  
ninety six acres, part of a patent granted to Joseph  
Leyd for 3,000 Acres, also two hundred and six, two  
acres in two parcels that was divided to the said Thomas  
Leyd by Peter Bush and George Leonard and conuniting  
in the whole to about two thousand two hundred and  
fifty one acres, be the same more or less, which &  
include the following plantations, to wit, Cecil place,  
Morgan place, the Bush place, and the place now  
occupied by Thomas Bratton on Popes road, together  
with the fixtures and appurtenances thereto belonging  
on said plantations, I also give unto my son in law Gordon  
Kent all my stock of cattle, that is now at Cecil, and Morgan  
place amounting in the whole to about thirty five, or forty  
head, also my stock of hogs that is now on Cecil place, I give  
unto my son in law Gordon Kent my interest of two  
tracts of land situated in the County of Montgomery on the  
waters of the North fork of Roanoke, which was patented  
to Thomas and David Leyd, one of which is a thousand

and seventy acres of ground above on the north side thereof, I give unto my son in law Gordon Kent negro slaves to all he hath now and after Esther and five children, to wit John, Martha, Jacob, Amos, and Harriet, also Charles and wife Emily, and her child Martha, and his wife Andy, by his first wife, also Cynthia and her son Frank, also Mary, a daughter of Nancy, also Black and a son of Negroes. Having closed my affairs and made a disposition of my property, I hereby direct my executors to make no sale of my property and no debt of any magnitude, and would select the worshipful Court of Delaski, to ask no security of my executors, and should they manage the affairs of my estate badly it will be their own loss and not the publick. I do hereby constitute and appoint my son David Lloyd and my son in law Gordon Kent executors with full power and authority to act as such. Being witness to my hand and seal, this 30<sup>th</sup> day of January 1842.
