Thomas Wagon of Pulaski County do make, this my last will and Testament in manner following, I direct my Executors hereafter named, to pay my debts, I may owe, and my first desire is for my wife Polly Wagon to receive a comfortable living in the domain where she now lives together with my son David Wagon, which I hereafter will make provision for, and should my son David Wagon depart this life before his mother, without any heir, in this event my wife Polly Wagon is hereby authorized to make such a disposition of my real as well as my personal Estate as she may think proper, I now make the following disposition of my real as well as my personal Estate, I give to my son David Wagon the following plantations and parcels of land, to wit, the plantation I now live on, also Trigg place, which lies immediately above, both of which is now called the Runhard Bottom, and was originally called Mahanaim in the old patent for mine, hundred acres granted to Garrett Bero, also all of the several tracts and parcels of land that I claim, adjoining said mine, hundred acres on the north and east side of New River, together with several more plantations, with their fixtures and appurtenances thereto belonging amounting in the whole to about four thousand acres, four hundred and twenty nine acres be the same more or less, this amount includes the said mine, hundred acres, also the lands that I claim on the south side of New River opposite the Runhard Bottom and that on the west side, including Egypt, together with the several plantations and appurtenances thereto belonging amounting in the whole to about two thousand and fifteen acres, be the same more or less. I give unto my son David Wagon my interest in the tract of land lots and claims by Thomas and

and the other two hundred and seventy acres, adjoining and below the above tract, which is situated in the County of Mercer, on Britains fork of Brush Creek. I give unto my son David Wagon the following negroes, slaves to wit, Moses and wife, Hannah and three of her sons, to wit, Allen, Stephen and Leathly, also Stephens wife, Mariah and son Henry, also Humphrey and his wife, Susannah and five children to wit, Edward, Elizabeth, Margaret, Luania and Felice, also Isaac and his wife Lydia, and three children, to wit, Luiza, Caroline, and William, also the following children of man Charles, by his first wife, to wit, Abram, Mathias, Lucy and Joseph, also his Edward, also Big Sam, also Daniel, also Hannah and two of her children to wit, Benjamin and Miriam, also Phiney and five of her children to wit, Rachel, Samuel, Son, Hezekiah, Ellen, I give unto my son David Wagon all my stack of cattle and horses and hogs, that is now on the Runhard Bottom and Egypt, and including a fleck of sheep that is now at Cecil place, also all of my gear and farming utensils. I give unto my son in law Gordon Bant, who married my daughter Lucinda, Wagon, the following tracts or parcels of land situate in the said County of Pulaski, on the waters of Rock Creek and falling spring waters of New River to wit Cecil place, four hundred and forty three acres, also thirty six acres adjoining the same, on the north and east sides, also fourteen acres adjoining said 443 acres and James Hoge, also one thousand four hundred and ninety six acres, part of a patent granted to Joseph Wagon for 3000 Acres, also two hundred and thirty two acres in two parcels that was divided to the said Thomas Wagon by Peter Bush and George Gordon and amounting in the whole to about two thousand two hundred and fifty one acres, be the same more or less, which I include the following plantations, to wit, Cecil place, Morgan place, the Bird place, and the place now occupied by Thomas Bratton on Papers road, together with the fixtures and appurtenances thereto belonging on said plantations, I also give unto my son in law Gordon Bant all my stack of cattle, that is now at Cecil, and Morgan place amounting in the whole to about thirty five or forty head, also my stack of hogs that is now in Cecil place, I give unto my son in law Gordon Bant my interest of two tracts of land situate in the County of Montgomery, on the waters of the North fork of Roanoke, which was patented to Thomas and David Wagon, one of which is Runhard Bottom

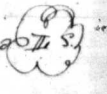
and seventy acres, adjoining above on the North side thereof, I give unto my son in law Gordon Kent negro slaves, to wit Nathaniel and wife, Cather and five children, to wit John, Martha, Jacob, Amos, and Harriet, also Charles and wife, Emmealy, and her child, Martha, and Charles son, Andy, by his first wife, also Scynthia, and her son Frank, also Mary, a daughter of Nancey, also Blackariah a son of Mages, Having done my affairs and made a disposition of my property, I hereby direct my Executors to make no sale of my property as I owe no debt of any magnitude, and would select the Honorable Court of Bulash, to ask no security of my Executors, and should they manage the affairs of my estate badly it will be their own loss and not the publick.
