John Scoops I John Scoops Son of Pulaski County and State of Virginia do make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. And as to such worldly estate as it has pleased God to entrust me with I dispose of the same as follows. First I direct that all debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my executors from any portion of my estate. and secondly I will to my sister Elizabeth Shirley fifteen hundred dollars and I hold a bond of five hundred dollars upon my brother Henry

son George Scoops for his share either while I am living or after my death, and Peter Scoops before mentioned is to have the interest of that same bond for his share until paid, it being the same bond that I now hold on my brother Henry son Peter, and willed above to George Scoops. The balance of my estate real and personal, which I may have at my decease I wish my Executor to sell, and turn into money. I hereby give my Executor power to make a good and lawful right to any lands or other property that I may have at my decease. I divide my estate into thirty four shares after the above named is paid, and divide as follows. First to my sister Catharine Pauls children four shares to Samuel Paul son one share of Samuel Pauls wife Elizabeth should survive her husband Samuel Paul Dec^d. I wish him to have his share, and to Catharine Paul one share, and to Peter Paul one share and to Catharine Scott one share and to Jacob Paul children to Samuel Paul one and Barbara Ann Whitgel each one half share next I will to my sister Sarah Smith deceased her four children four shares first to John Smith one share to George Smith one share and to Mary Musler one share, and to Sarah Cies one share, and next I will to my brother Henry Scoops deceased to his three children three shares, to John Scoops one share, and to Henry Scoops one share, and to Catharine Deal to her or her children one share, and I will to my brother George Scoops Dec^d four shares to Henry Scoops one share, George Scoops son one share, Catharine Patterson one share, Sarah Scott one share, and I will to my brother Peter Scoops six shares and to my sister Esther Shirley Dec^d six shares or her children as follows to George Shirley one share, and to and to William Shirley one share, and to Sarah Bryan one share, to Emily Shirley one share to Sarah McFall one share, and to Andrew Nations one share, and I will to my sister Susanah Kuffman six shares. I hold a bond executed to me by Johnathan Shirley for one hundred dollars, which bond is to be taken in the thirty four portion, provided it is not paid during my life time. I do hereby make and ordain my esteemed friend Joseph Collops of Pulaski County City, and George Scoops of Rockingham City, and State of Virginia as my Executors, if I should depart this life while in Pulaski County I wish my friend Joseph Collops to act as only Executor, and if I should depart this life in Rockingham City, it is then my desire, that my friend and relation George Scoops should act as only Executor.
