John Slooper I John Slooper Senior of Pulaski County and State of Virginia
Will nominate and publish this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking and making void all former Wills by me
at any time heretofore made. And as to such worldly estate as it
has pleased God to entitute me with I dispose of the same as
follows. First I direct that all debt and funeral expenses be
paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money
that shall come into the hands of my executors from any
portion of my estate, and secondly I will to my sister Elizabeth
Shultz fifteen hundred dollars and I hold
a bond of five hundred dollars upon my brother Hugh

John George Slooper for his three sister while I am living or after
my death, and Peter Slooper before mentioned is to have the inter-
est of that same bond for his share until paid, it being the same
bond that I now hold on my brother Hugh son Peter, and
willed above to George Slooper. The balance of my estate real
and personal, which I may have at my decease I wish my
Executor to sell, and turn into money. I hereby give my Executor
power to make as good and lawful right to any lands or other
property that I may have at my decease. I divide my estate
into thirty four shares after the above named is paid, and divide
as follows. First to my sister Catharine Pauls children five shares
to Samuel Paul son on Shaw of Samuel Pauls wife Elizabeth
should survive her husband Samuel Paul son. I wish him to
have his share, and to Abraham Butt one Shaw, and to Peter
Paul one Shaw and to Catharine Slooper one Shaw and to
Jacob Pauls children to Samuel Paul son and Barbara Ann
Whitel each one half Shaw next I will to my Sister Sarah
Smith deceased her four children four shares first to John
Smith one Shaw to George Smith one Shaw and to Mary
Museler one Shaw and to Sarah Ota one Shaw, and next I
will to my brother Henry Slooper deceased to his three children
three Shaw, to John Slooper one Shaw, and to Henry Slooper one
Shaw, and to Catharine Deal to her or her children one Shaw
and I will to my brother George Slooper Dece^r four shares to
Henry Slooper one Shaw, George Slooper one Shaw,
Catharine Patterson one Shaw, Sarah Sweet one Shaw, and
I will to my brother Peter Slooper six Shaw and to my sister
Esther Shirley Dece^r six Shaw or her children as follows to George
Shirley one Shaw, and to and to William Shirley one Shaw,
and to Sarah Ryan one Shaw to Fanny Sheets one Shaw to
Sarah McFall one Shaw and to Aselin Watson one Shaw
and I will to my sister Susanah Huffman six Shaw. I hold
a bond executed to me by Jonathan Shirley for one hundred
dollars which bond is to be taken in the Shirley portion, pro-
vided it is not paid during my life time. I do hereby make
and ordain my esteemed friends Joseph Clegg of Pulaski
County City, and Hugh Slooper of Rockingham City, and
State of Virginia as my Executors, if I should depart this
life while in Pulaski County I wish my friend Joseph
Clegg to act as only Executor, and if I should depart
this life in Rockingham City it is then my desire, that
my friend and relation Hugh Slooper should act as only
