Virginia, being sound mind and memory do make and declare
this my last will and testament in manner and form following
viz. I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Miller one hundred
acres of land, it being that part which he has in possession
or so much of said quantity as he may think proper to take,
and if the said Lot of land should be more than ^{his} my proportion-
able part of my Estate he shall pay the surplus to my Executors
to be equally divided among the other Legatees. All the rest &
residue of my estate real and personal I give and bequeath to
my dear beloved wife Lucy Miller during her natural life and
afterwards to be equally divided among my children whom I shall
hereafter name viz Francis Miller, Cassandra Miller, Rachel
Hume, Jane Miller, Mary & A. Hawkins, Susanna Miller and
Sarah Vaughan's proportionable part I give and bequeath to
her children, to be equally divided between them viz Julia
Vaughan, Johnson Vaughan, Lucinda Vaughan Emma & Van-
han, and Will Vaughan; To my son in law William
Vaughan, I give the sum of one dollar, his wife's propor-
tionable part having already been bequeathed to her children
and if at any time it should be considered necessary, my
wife shall be liberty to sell any part of my personal est-
ate, and use the money for her support or divide the same
equally among my children; my wife Lucy Miller and

han, and Will Vaughan; To my son in law William
Vaughan, I give the sum of one dollar, his wife's proportion-
able part having already been bequeathed to her children
and if at any time it should be considered necessary, my
