of Virginia do make and publish this my last will and
testament in the manner and form following, to wit:
First I give to the children of Charles Robertson my son, the
sum of ten dollars to be equally divided between them the
said children of Giles Robertson deceased, he having heretofore
received his part before he left this Country.

Secondly I give to my daughter Mary Robinson together
with Anne Beck, Fench and Louisa during her natural
life with all their increase But should the said Mary
Robinson leave no issue the said Legacy shall descend to
my Grand daughter Martha Turner.

Thirdly I give to my Grand daughter Martha Turner together
with Nathaniel, Rose, Lena, John, and Rebecca and their in-
crease forever.

Fourthly I give the balance of my property not willed nor named
to be equally divided between my daughter Mary Robinson
and my Grand daughter Martha Turner except my stock
of cash which I give to my daughter Mary Robinson

Wife, I desire that some well qualified person should have the liberty
to live with my daughter or Grand as she may desire
legally, and lastly I appoint Thomas & Jefferson my executor
of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand this 1st day of June 1837.
