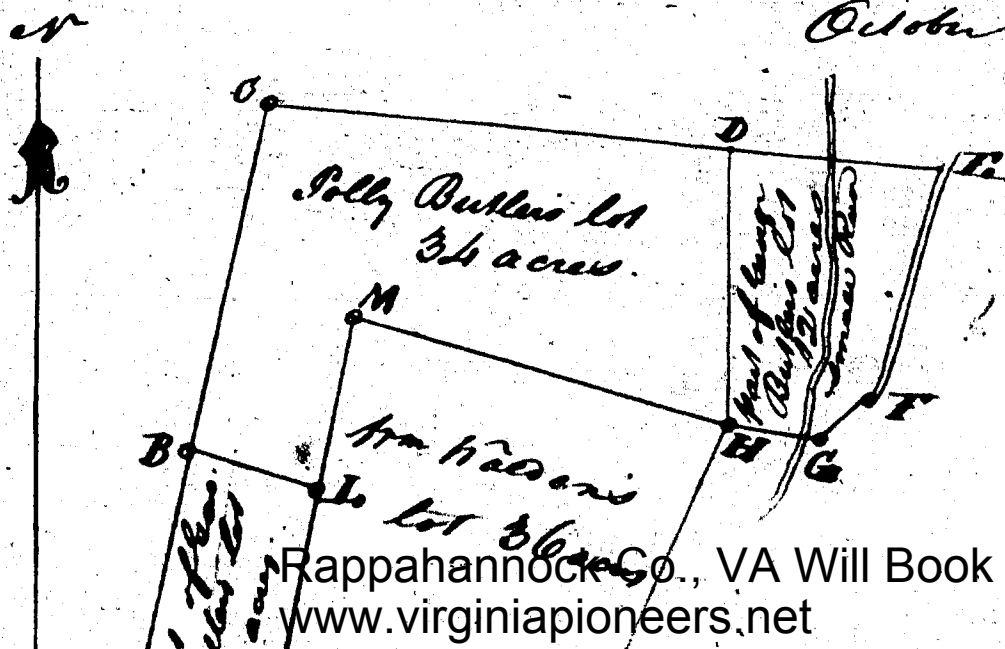
George Butler's Woodland lot, Begins at a stake corner to William Walden

 as fully and as effectually as if the same had been made in pursuance
 of a decree of the Court, appointing said Commissioners for said purpose
 to the true and faithful performance of one to the other of said agree-
 ments they bind themselves, themselves &c. each to the other in the sum of five
 hundred dollars, as witness our hands and seals the day and date
 as above written.

In conformity to an agreement entered into on the 15 day of September
 1835 and hereunto annexed, between John Butler, George Butler, Polly
 Butler and William Watson (the said William Watson having purchased
 the share of Joseph Butler and Robert Butler) the subscribers being
 appointed by said agreement for that purpose have decided the land
 to Elizabeth Butler as her dower in the land of her late husband John
 Butler deceased, agreeable to the said agreement. John Butler hereby
 transferred his share to his Brother George

appointed by said agreement further purpose have decided the land allotted
to Elizabeth Butler as her dower in the land of her late husband John
Butler deceased agreeable to the above plat. John Butler subsequent
to said agreement having transferred his share to his Brother George and
devised us to assign the same to the said George, between the said
George Butler, Polly Butler and William Walden. Given under our
this 16th day of October 1836

In Rappahannock County Court August 1837

This division of the dower land of Elizabeth Butler devised
together with an agreement between the parties interested, thereto
annexed, was this day produced in court, and the said agreement
was approved by the oath of Richard Kinsey, one of the subscribing
instruments thereto, and ordered to be certified. ind at a Court
held for said County on the 12 day of February 1838.

This said division of the dower land of Elizabeth Butler and
together with the agreement between the parties interested, thereto
annexed which was partly proved at August Court 1837
was again produced in open court, and fully proved by the oath
of Zephaneh Turner, the other subscribing witness thereto — And
the same with the Report of the commissioners thereunto was
ordered to be recorded.
