Frank Payne of the County of Louisa and State of Virginia do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills heretofore made by me in manner and form following that is to say.

First. I desire that so much of my perishable estate be immediately sold, after my decease, as will be sufficient to pay and satisfy all my just debts and funeral expenses which I wish as promptly paid, as the nature and circumstances of my estate will permit.

Then after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses, and of such Special Legacies as is hereinafter directed to be paid, I give to my beloved wife Martha Payne one half part of all my estate, both Real, Personal or mixed for and during her natural life, and after her decease I give the same to my children hereafter named (except the one to whom a Special Legacy is given by me) to be divided among them in equal parts to be enjoyed by them forever.

By a will for certain reasons (to be seen by you to which) I give and
sell to Virginia Currency to be and to be forever.

1st To John Robinson who entered into with my daughter Amanda
the having died without issue and for reasons known to me I give
also the sum of one dollar Virginia Currency, as the portion allotted
for her, to him and his heirs forever. The Residue and Balance
of my Estate of every kind, Real, Personal and mixed, It is
my will and desire shall be equally divided among the following
of my Children to wit: Palmy, William, Francis, John, James
Enderby, Alexander, Stephen, John, Samuel, and George
Leaves to them and their Heirs to be enjoyed by them forever.
2^{ndly} and Lastly, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint
my son William T. Payne being the second above named
the Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby after
revoking all others heretofore made by me, with a special
request to my before named Executor, that he will have all the
requests contained in this will promptly and faithfully executed.
