Item 1st It is my desire that all my just debts shall be paid
as soon as convenient.

Item 2nd: I give and bequeath to my wife Margaret Duncan
during her natural life, all my Estate both personal and Real,
to be possessed and enjoyed by her during her natural life.

Item 3rd: I leave one half of my Estate to my wife Margaret
Duncan to dispose of at her own Will and pleasure.

Item 4th I leave to my sister Smith Johnson, one dollar, and
Elizabeth Hunt one dollar, and Sally Vance 1 dollar, and
Polly Gainer 1 dollar.

Item 5th I leave to my Sister Lucy Thackerall the remaining part of
my Estate.

Item 6th I want my funeral preached from these words, I have
spent my life for my people, to the best of my recollection it is
in memory.

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint and appoint my Executors
Edward P. Duncan and Peter Seal of this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me
made. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix
my Seal this twenty fifth day of August Eighteen hundred and
thirty six, acknowledged and delivered by George Duncan

This last Will and Testament of George Duncan deceased, was this day exhibited to the Court, proved by the oath of William Thornhill, Bryant Thornhill and John J. Brunning three of the Subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of Edward P. Duncan one of the Executors named in the last Will and Testament aforesaid, who made oath thereto, and together with James Kemper and Peter Seal his Executors entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of \$5000. conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form. Peter Seal the other Executor named in the last Will and Testament came into Court and refused to take upon himself the duties of the Executor thereof.
