for Cash or other terms and the money to be equally divided between my children
herein after to be mentioned and as to my personal estate I give to my daughter
Sally Hittle one cow I give to my daughter Leah one bed and furniture & one
cow, I give to my grand daughter Eliza McIntire one bed and furniture and
one cow, I desire that my house called Jack shall be sold and the ballance of
my stock to remain for the use of my family above mentioned together with my
eight day mettal clock, chest of drawers, kitchen furniture and such other ar-
ticles of House hold furniture as my family above named may stand in need of
The ballance of my personal estate to be sold and out of the money arising from
such sale to give to my daughter Lydia McIntire or Mellon twenty five dollars
extra also my daughters Sally and Leah and my grand daughter Eliza Mc-
Intire twenty five dollars each extra, and should there not be money enough aris-
ing from the sale of the personal estate to pay the specific legacies the ballance

to her Solima Tidwell.

Now I do hereby declare this present writing to be as a codicil to my said will and annexed thereto and make a part thereof. It is now my desire that in relation to the legacies left my daughters now with me, namely Sally Hittle Leah Hittle, Lydia McIntire or Melton & my Grand daughter Eliza McIntire, shall be enjoyed by them and the Heirs of their bodies and in the event of either of my said daughters or my sd. Grand Daughters marrying then it is my will and desire that they forfeit their home which was devised to them in my will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of January 1836.

In Rappahannock County Court

This last Will and testament of Jacob Hittle deceased was this day exhibited to the Court, proved by the oaths of Absalom Jordan and Enoch Tison two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and together with the Codicil thereto annexed, which was proved by the oath of Absalom Jordan one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, is ordered to be certified. And at a Court continued and held for said County of Rappahannock on Wednesday the 16th day of November 1836. This said last Will and testament of Jacob Hittle deceased, (which was proved at October Court last) together with the Codicil thereto annexed (which was partly proved at October Court last) was this day again produced in Court, and the said Codicil fully proved by the oath of Robert Eastham a subscribing witness thereto, and thereupon the said Will and Codicil is ordered to be recorded; On the motion of Joseph Settle one of the Exors. therein named, who made oath, together with Robert Eastham and Franklin Turner his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Four Thousand dollars, conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. Robert Eastham the other Exor. named in the said last will and testament, this day came into Court, and refused to take upon himself the burthen of the execution thereof.
