

W Thornton's In the name of God Amen! I, Jane Thornton of Thornton County in the County of Rappahannock and State of Virginia do make ordain and declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, viz:

Imprimis - I desire my Executors hereinafter named to sell all of my personal property except my slaves for the payment of my debts should there be any. Item, I give to my Grandson Alfred A. Thornton all that may be due or coming to me from the Estate of my deceased Uncle General George Washington, from and after the date of this instrument - I also give to my said Grandson my Case for holding liquors with all its contents, and my clock. I also give and bequeath to my said Grandson one equal fourth part of all my slaves ^{one equal fourth part of the residue} ~~and one equal fourth part of~~ of all my Estate not hereinafter bequeathed of every kind whatsoever and wherever situated to him and his Heirs forever. -

Item - I give and bequeath to my Grandsons George A. Thornton and Alfred H. Thornton each one equal fourth part of all my slaves with the exception of those hereinafter devised likewise to each one fourth of the rest and residue of all my Estate not hereinafter bequeathed of every kind whatsoever to them and their Heirs forever.

Item. The remainder of the property I have designed for my Grand Daughters hereinafter bequeathed to them and their Heirs forever.

Item. The remaining fourth part of my Estate excepting what I hereinafter bequeath, which I had designed for my Grand Daughter Caroline W. Thompson till I had reason to suppose, that she is to receive a portion of the Estate of her late sister Matilda Thompson.

I now reposing the highest confidence in the integrity and justice of my Grand son Alfred Thornton, leave to him to be distributed or not with his sister and Brothers, as he may deem just and proper. Item - I give to my Grand daughter Mary Frances Thornton, Lucy and her daughter Sally ^{with} ~~and~~ their increase for the life only of the said Mary Frances, and after her death to her issue, if any, but should she die without issue my will is that the said Slaves should go to her sister Elizabeth and her issue, if any, but should she be dead without issue, then to my surviving Grand children or their representatives. Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth A. T. Thornton my servant Eric Mannab's kinsman Lydia, the daughter of Lucy with their increase for the life only of the said Elizabeth, and after her death to her issue if any, but should she die without issue, then my will is that the said Slaves with their increase shall go to her sister Mary Frances and her issue, if any, but should she be dead without issue to my surviving Grand children or their representatives. Item I give

Luz and her daughter Sally ^{with} ~~and~~ their increase for the life only of
the said Mary Frances, and after her death to her issue, if any,
but should she die without issue my will is that the said
slaves should go to her sister Elizabeth and her issue, if any, but
should she be dead without issue, then to my surviving grand children
or their representatives. Item I give and bequeath to my Grand
Daughter Elizabeth & A. J. Thornton my servant Eric ~~Mannab~~
Lekema Lydia, the daughter of Luz with their increase for the
life only of the said Elizabeth, and after her death to her issue
if any, but should she die without issue, then my will is that the
said slaves with their increase shall go to her sister Mary Frances
and her issue, if any, but should she be dead without issue to my
surviving grand children or their representatives. Item I give
and bequeath to my three grand daughters Mary Frances, Thornton
Elizabeth & A. J. Thornton and Jane Washington & A. Thornton one
hundred dollars in cash to be paid to each of them by my executors
hereinafter named, but they are authorized to expend the one
hundred dollar hereby bequeathed to my grand daughter Jane
in the prosecution of any suit that may be pending, or hereafter

instituted, for her benefit, or pay it to her when she attains the age of sixteen at their discretion. Item - I give to Ann Mason the sum of fifty dollars, for a ring as a memento of my affection. Item - I give to my faithful friend Thomas Warden my sideboard as a memento of my esteem ^{friendship} for him.

Lastly - I constitute and appoint my Grandson Alfred A. Thorne and Thomas Warden my Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other and former Wills by me heretofore made.
