My dear friends and disposing mind to make this my
last will and Testament hereby revoking all others.

1st I give and bequeath to my wife the possession and oc-
cupancy of her room and such portion of the household fur-
niture as she may wish, and land convenient to the house for
her to cultivate and the following slaves i.e. Maria, Fiddling, Mary
Ann, Eve, and Charity to have and to hold the same for her
life, also 7 good horses, and the use of my Carriage in common
with my daughters Fanny and Mary, and the third of my stock
and farming utensils.

2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary the wife of
John Porter of Fauquier to her and her heirs forever, the tract or
parcel of land Bel of William Kitchman and now occupied
by James G. Waters, containing about 1600 acres with the
mills thereon, also one other Tract of 200 acres lot of
Henry Kland and Elias Corder, on which James Leake now
lives, also one other Tract of 500 acres a part of the new
Survey, on the name of myself and my Brothers Lewis and Jasper
together with the following Slaves now in her possession i.e.
Cassie, Mary, Sam, Caroline, Ann, Mahitah, and Abby
and then increase, also one horse and five hundred dollars
which I have given her to appt on paying for Mr Porters Land.

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny, to her and her
Heirs forever, one half of the land inherited by me of my Father
in which I now live, the other half to be sold at the
Blazed Rectory where John Clark lives, then to the House
of the same name.

in which I now live, the dividing line to begin at the
Blazed Hickory, near where Josiah Clark lives, thence to the House
and from the House, so as to divide it equally, with his sister
not mentioned, also the one half of the following Tracts of land
viz. one of 3 1/2 acres given me by my Father, adjoining the
House Tract - One of 200 acres purchased by one of my Brother
Spencer and his children, which he intended of his Father, also
a Tract of 100 acres, on which Elias Clark now lives, purchased
of Elijah Anderson, also one other Tract of 200 acres on which
John White now lives, and purchased of Blackby Martin and wife
at the mouth of my Mill and Lot, also the one half of a Tract
purchased by my son William of his uncle Spencer called the
Round House Tract - Together with the following Slaves, viz:
Mary, Mimi, Caroline, Eliza, Rheuben, Elijah, Charles,
and the sum of Two Hundred dollars.

And I give and bequeath to my daughter Katy, to her and her heirs
forever, the remaining half of the Tracts of land mentioned in
the above bequest to my daughter Fanny, including the mill and
Lot (it being my intention to divide the above mentioned land
equally between them, and for them to hold the House in
common with their Mother during her life) also the following
named Slaves, Kate, Sam, Betty, Jack, Edmund, Thomas,
and Ransom and their increase, together with five hundred
dollars.

And I further direct that the remainder of my Slaves not
above mentioned be equally divided between my other daughters
Fanny, Lucy, Rappahannock, Co, VA, Will, Book, A, 1833-1842
as to be above Lucy, Rappahannock, Co, VA, Will, Book, A, 1833-1842
and Lucy.
