County of Rappahannock, and state of Virginia, (being of sound
mind and memory,) do make and ordain this to be my
last will and testament, concerning that portion of my
perishable & moveable property, of which I shall die possessed
which would otherwise go to the heirs of my daughter Lu-
dith Keith & her husband Peyton Keith, after my decease.
(My negroes excepted.)

Item 1st. It is my will and desire, that the abovesaid
portion, (viz. one child's part of my money, stock, furniture,
grains, and ^{all} other perishable property (excepting negroes,) which I
shall own at my death,) which would otherwise descend
to my daughter Ludith Keith & her husband Peyton Keith, shall be
and hereby is given, to the daughters of the abovesaid Ludith
Keith, and be equally divided among them. ~~their~~ names are as
follows viz. Mary T. Keith, Eliza Ann Keith, Ludith Keith, Susan
T. Keith, America L. Keith, and Caroline M. Keith. The terms of

or guardians, who shall take care of, and deliver their
several portions at the proper times. The abovesaid legals
now live in the west.
