I, John Mitchell of said County and State, being of sound mind and Memory do make my last will and testament in the following manner my

My will and desire is that, after my decease, and all my Just Dells are paid, the remainder of my estate, both Real and Personal be possessed by my wife, Rose Robinson during her life.

Item At the decease of my wife, I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Ann White, my 2 Negroes, a Middy and 20 Sabies, and her children Frederick and a Matilda, with the future increase of said 2 Negroes, and also all the personal property of every kind, belonging to my estate, except that, which is hereafter bequeathed.

Item It is my will and desire that my said daughter, Sarah Ann White shall have my 2 Negroes Charlotte and her mother Rose Jack, Harrison and Frederick, Polly and her child Robert and my 2 Negro man Jack, with the future increase of said 2 Negroes with the Special Trust and understanding, that the annual profits of said 2 Negroes shall be annually applied to the actual individual support and maintenance of my son William Mitchell Robinson, and his wife Elizabeth, and the children of their marriage, and in no other way, whatsoever, during their joint and several lives

Mitchael Robinson, and his wife Elizabeth, and the children of their marriage, are in no other way whatsoever, during their joint and several lives.

And it is further understood as my will and desire, that on the death of my said son, and his wife, the above said & before mentioned increase, shall be the property of their children; if they should be any if not, that the said & before mentioned be equally divided, between my Grand Children Benjamin Franklin White, and Elizabeth White. Item I give and bequeath my tract of Land in Shenandoah County conveyed to me by Moses & Henry and his wife by a Deed recorded in the office of the County Court of Shenandoah to my aforesaid son and daughter to be equally divided between them.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my son William C. Mitchell Robinson Executor of this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand and seal, the day and year above written.
