1844. Now Last will and testament of William Garrison dec'd was
brought forward to the Court and proved by the oaths of Thomas
Holzman and Bryant Thornbuck, two of the subscribers, witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded. And as a Court held for said County, on
Monday the 4th day of July 1844. On the motion of William Garrison
the Court made in this said last will and testament of William
Garrison dec'd which was proved and ordered to be recorded at said
Court last, and who made oath, and together with Elijah Little et
al (justified in open Court as to his sufficiency) entered into an
acknowledgment a bond in the penalty of \$10,000 conditioned as the
Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a Patent
thereof in due form.
