

W. Hadden. In the name of God Amen! I Samuel Maddy of the County of
the County of Rappahannock in the State of Virginia being of
sound mind and disposing memory and knowing the
uncertainty of life, do make this my last will and testament
revoaking all others heretofore made by me.

First I wish all my just debts and funeral expenses paid
Second I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
Maddy my whole estate Real, personal and mixed,
to do and use as she may see proper during her natural
life.

Third If there should be any thing left at the death of my
wife Mary Maddy it is then my wish and desire that
my nephew Samuel Maddy (son of Benjamin Maddy) shall
have the remainder of my whole estate at the death of my
wife aforesaid, Mary Maddy, and if he should die without
an heir, then it is my wish and desire that my nephew
William Maddy (son of Benjamin Maddy) shall have the
remainder of my whole estate, at the death of the aforesaid
Samuel Maddy.

Fourth. It is further my wish and desire that the Court may
not require security of my Executors. Henceforth signed and
do hereby constitute my beloved wife Mary Maddy

an heir, then it is my wish and desire that the said
William Maddox (son of Bennett Maddox) shall have the
remainder of my whole estate, at the death of the said
Samuel Maddox.

And I further wish and desire that the said
not acquire security of my Executors hereafter named. And I
do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Maddox
my Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In testimony
whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this
25 day of July Eighteen Hundred and thirty seven.
