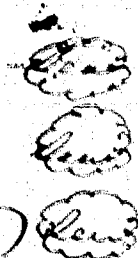

In obedience to an order of the County Court of Rappahannock
bearing date December 1835 (to us directed Elisha Camp, Francis
M. Jeffries, and Thomas Weatherage being first duly sworn in regard
to the said order to examine, state and settle the administration
account of Susan Giggly Administratrix of the estate of Edmund
Giggly deceased. We find that the said administratrix has received
the sum of Fifty seven Dollars from Benwell K. Wood Guardian for
the deceased, as the above is stated in the above. And we also
have good and sufficient vouchers produced us, to substantiate
the above credits as stated. We have allowed the said administratrix
the sum of four dollars and twenty nine and a half cents, as a
commission for her services in settling the said estate, which is nearly
eight percent, which we believe she is justly entitled to as the
estate is small. The above account as stated shows, that
the said Susan Giggly administratrix has appropriated the sum of
fifty seven dollars to the benefit of the said estate, which makes
a complete settlement of all the assets she has received. Given
under our hands and Seals this 21st day of July. One thousand
eight hundred and thirty seven.

said children of Silas Robertson deceased, he having heretofore
received his part before he left this Country.

Secondly I give to my daughter Mary Robertson to give
