Item 1st. I give to my Executors hereafter named In Special Trust as
to have created and for no other purpose or object than the same
Trust the following Real and Personal Estate, namely, a certain
part or parcel of Land, comprehended within the following boundaries,
Beginning at the Gate opening into Thomas Walden's plantation
thence with the road to a stake between my plantation and Thomas
Walden's, thence with the road in my plantation, opposite an
old Blacksmith's Shop, a small distance from said Gate, thence
a straight line to a red oak crosscut which is a large pile of stones, in
or near the corner of the meadow fence, on the side of a ditch, near a
cypress, thence to a locust standing in a field, back of my dwelling
House on the side of a ditch, about which are a number of Stone
piles, thence to the Gate at the road, on the side of a tract, north
of the house, thence to John Dicks line, at a section, thence with
the line of the Tract of land purchased of Bro Thompson to the
Beginning, including the north part of said Tract of land, purchased
of the said Bro Thompson, and which said part of said Tract of
land, includes my dwelling House, and improvements, and much
the greatest part of my meadow; Also that portion of my property
Real and Personal I devise to my said Executors in the next clause of
my Will for the Trusts and purposes intended to be created herein,
And all which said property real and personal, I give, devise
and bequeath to my said Executors upon the following trusts, that is,
to say, that the rents and profits thereof, shall be funds in the
hands of my said Executors, to be paid to my said children, so long as the said

and bequeaths to my said Executors upon the following trusts, that is, to say, that the rents and profits thereof, shall be funds in the hands of said Executors as Trustees for the maintenance of my son Thomas Hughes, his wife and children, so long as the said Thomas and his present wife shall live; and the object of this Trust, I now more specially set forth, my son Thomas is to be supplied, with comfortable food and raiment, so far as the usual necessities of life require it; and not for objects of dissipation, the said family so long as it can be done, to live upon the property and enjoy in that way the rents and profits thereof, always subject to my Executors' control for the object of this Trust. The children to be maintained, raised and educated according to the opinion of my Executors and their condition in life. And should it so happen in the progress of time that the rents and profits be more than adequate to these objects, the surplus to go to the children of my said son Thomas Hughes, and should he live after his children an all of age or married and settled off; then, and in such case, the land and other property given in the bequest of my Executors, be divided, among my son Thomas's children, reserving however to him and his wife the means of living out off it upon the usual necessities of food and raiment. And upon my son Thomas's death, my Will and devise is, that all the Estate given in this clause of my Will, to my Executors for the purposes of this Trust, shall be divided equally (as far as may be) between his living children, and such of them as any of them have issue.

Item And I Will and desire to my son Benjamin, and to my daughter
Lucy Warden, and to my son Thomas Hughes. (And the part or share of
Thomas Hughes I give to my Executors for the ~~first~~ estate in the first
Clause of this my Will, and to be held by them for the objects and
under the limitations therein set forth.) the remainder of all my property
both real and personal to be divided between them share and share alike.
And I hereby Will and desire that my Executors sell upon reasonable
time the whole of the property both real and personal, hereby devised
to my son Benjamin, daughter Lucy Warden, and to them my Executors
in trust for my son Thomas, his wife and children, and the proceeds of
such sale to make a fund for divisions as above directed.

The said division to be made in three equal parts, but in allotting to
each his share), and to my Executors the portion of Thomas Hughes in
trust, as directed, each one of them, is to be charged with all arrears
real or personal made to them heretofore, which being brought into
Settlement, the Surplus is to be made, taking in past and present
debts, gifts, and grants. Lucy Warden's lands are to be taken and
to be charged in Settlement at twenty shillings the acre. Benjamin
at fifty shillings the acre and the part for the benefit of Thomas
and his (children) in trust to my Executors at twenty shillings the
acre.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint my son Benjamin Hughes
and Peter Smoore Executors of this my last Will and Testament,
and Trustee for the benefit of Thomas Hughes his wife and children.
In Witness of all which, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 8th day of May 1842.

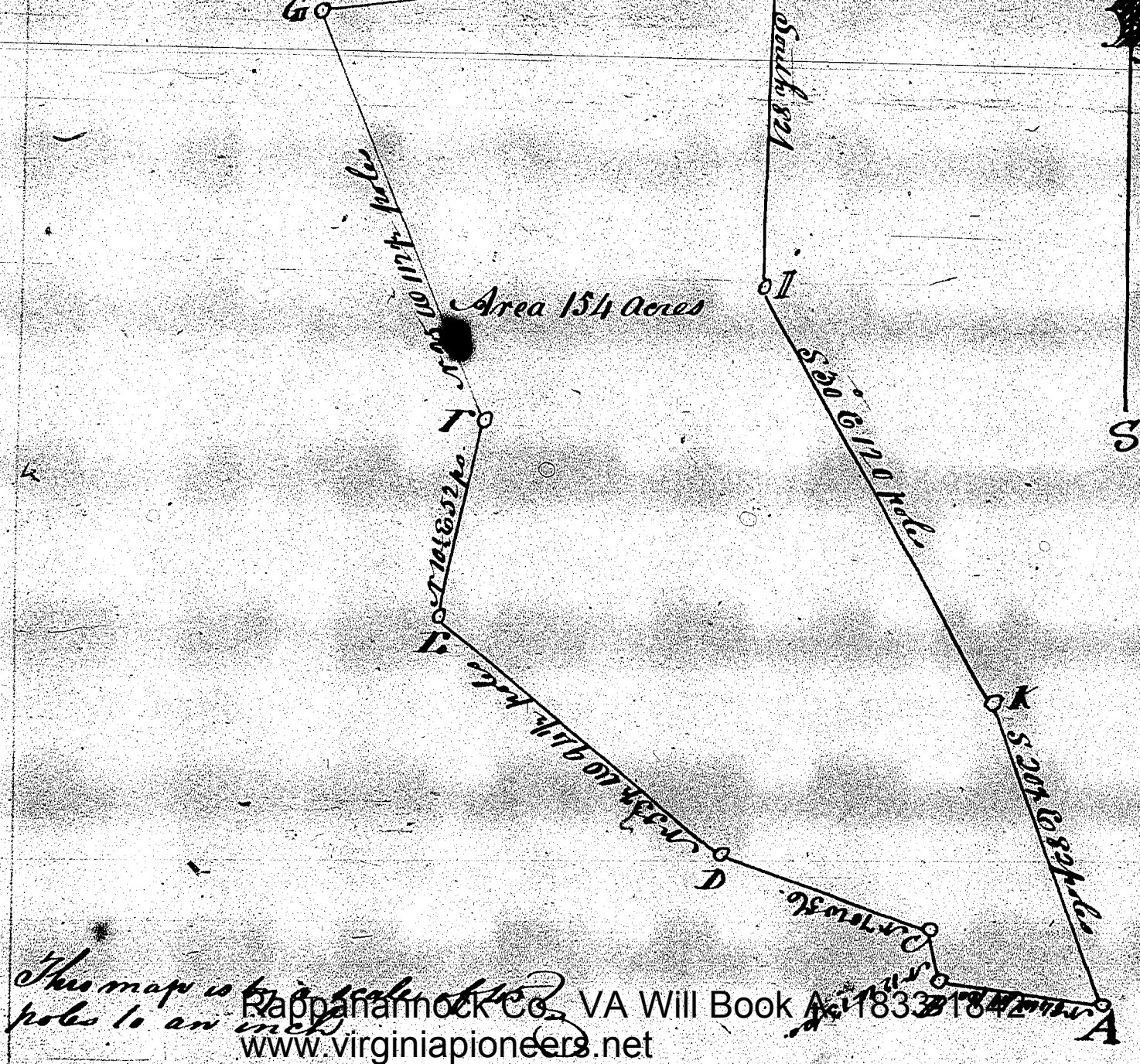
