Bryant is being of sound mind & memory but life being uncertain, I
will I give my role unto he who first gave it to me, I do make this my
last will, it is my will and desire, that my wife Mary O'Bannon
she page 366 shall have one third part of my estate both personal & real, as
qualification long as she lives & after her death, to be equally divided amongst
of John & all my children hereafter mentioned, it is my will & desire that my
O'Bannon executor sell my land in the County of Fauquier & divide the money
equally amongst all my children, my book account which I
may have charges against any one of my children is to be deducted
from their part of my personal & real estate; John Brady & Nancy
Brady have at this time in their possession several negroes to wit
a negro woman by the name of Lavinia & a negro woman by the
name of Ann the above named two women & all their increase, which
they have at this time or may hereafter have up to my death, I

shall require of the said John Brady & Nancy Brady coming as my heirs
to bring home the above two negro women and also their
increase as to my death & for them with the balance of my
negroes to be equally divided amongst all my children, here
after mentioned, but in the event of the said John Brady &
Nancy Brady or their heirs or executors should fail to bring
home at my death the above named negroes & their increase
it in that event is to be their full portion of my estate both
personal & real & the balance of my property both personal &
real to be equally divided amongst my children hereafter
mentioned John M O'bannon & Walter O'bannon & Joseph O'bannon
& Sarah O'bannon & Mary O'bannon & James O'bannon & Jane
O'bannon & Charles Bryant O'bannon & Eliza O'bannon & Lucy
O'bannon; and the said John Brady & Nancy Brady is also to
pay out of their part of my personal & real estate, the sum
of thirty five Dollars a year for the rent of my Land on
which they live at present, up to my death, & the rent to
commence from the 1 of January 1830, so long as he lives on
said land, but without any interest, but as I have before men-
tioned should said John Brady & Nancy Brady or their heirs
or executors fail to bring home at my death the above two ne-
gro women Lucinda & Anne & all their increase, which they
have at present or may hereafter have so that they can be
equally divided at my death amongst all my children, then
the said John Brady & Nancy Brady or their heirs is not

in any way to have one cent more of my estate other person
or persons who price my goods & see their increase be
brought home as above alluded to, the said John Brady & Nancy
Brady or their heirs is to have their equal share of my estate
both personal & real subject to the deduct of thirty five
Dollars per year from the 1 of January 1830 up to my death; I do
hereby lastly constitute and appoint my son John M O Ban-
non & Walter O Bannon my executors to this my last will. As
witness my hand & seal the 23 of October 1841

This last will & testament of Bryant O Bannon dec^d, was this
day produced to the Court, proved by the oaths of George Eggborn
& Thomas Fletcher the subscribing witnesses thereto & sworn to
be genuine. And on the motion of Walter O Bannon one of the
executors therein named, who swears with the oaths & together with
George Eggborn, Elizabeth B. Oannon, James M O Bannon & Charles
O Bannon his co-executors entered into & acknowledged their bond
in the penalty of \$25,000 conditional as the Law directs, a certificate
being granted him for obtaining a probat. thereof in due form. Liberty
being given to the other executor named in the said will to join in
the probat. when he shall think fit.
