Word Bur In the name of God, amen; I Russell R Wood of the County of Rappahannock & State of Virginia; being of sound mind & disposing memory but in a very low state of bodily health desire to make this my last will & testament in the manner of form following.

- 1st First, I desire that my funeral expenses and all just lawful debts be first paid and at as early a period as practicable.
- Secondly It is my wish and desire that all my estate both real & personal be kept together for the support of my wife & children until my daughter Mary becomes of age or marries and in the happening of either of these events at her request commissioners appointed for that

purpose by the court may appear to my said daughter, ^{for my said daughter}
of my estate to them, may seem equitable, taking into
consideration the circumstances of the family at the time.
Thirdly. In the event of the death of my daughter Mary before at-
taining to the age of twenty one years or before she marries then
I desire that there shall be no division of my estate until my son
William becomes of age; but if William should die before he attains
to the age of twenty one years then should my son John survive
him such division as is above named shall take place when he
becomes of age.

Fourthly. If my wife should marry or die before any of my children
become of age then there shall be an immediate & equal division
between my four children viz. Mary, William, John & Jane one
third of the estate to be allotted to my wife in the event of her
marriage to be held by her during the term of her natural life
Sixthly. Should my wife not marry when even there is a division
of my estate it is my wish that she shall have one third of my estate
for & during the term of her natural life.

Lastly I hereby appoint my beloved wife Jane the executrix of this
my last will & Testament, & I request that my brother in law
Thomas Deatherage may aid & advise my wife in the management
of my estate & the education of my children. Given from under
my hand & seal this 13th day of October 1844
