mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose
of whatever estate I possess - I give and bequeath the same the
manner following, (viz):

First. I desire that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
Second and lastly. I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth
Mason my entire interest in the house and lot in the town of
Flint Hill which we own jointly and at this time occupy together
to have and to hold, to use and to dispose of in whatever manner
she may think proper, also I give and bequeath in like manner
all the house hold and other furniture of every description which
I may own separately or jointly with my said sister Elizabeth
Mason to use and dispose of in any manner she may think proper.
I hereby constitute my sister Elizabeth Mason my executor of this
my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former

will or testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 16th day of November 1825.
