youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years, then
in either case, my will and desire is that my said wife
Mary G. Brown be put to her thirds and enjoy them forever
dispose of them as she may think proper. The other two
thirds of my estate I give to my four children hereinafter
mentioned to be equally divided among them and enjoyed
by them forever, viz; to Henry G. Brown one fourth part, to
William M. Brown one fourth part, to James M. Brown one
fourth part and to Paul G. Brown one fourth part. And
lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my brother Wm M.
Brown and Paul Gates Jr. Executors of my will.
