and testament hereby revoking all others.

Item 1st It is my will and desire that my executor hereinafter  
named shall pay all my just debts and funeral expenses  
out of any portion of my estate they may think it necessary  
and best for the interest of my wife and children, to be paid.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances  
after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, all my  
estate both real and personal for and during her natural life.

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that after the death of my  
wife, my estate shall be equally divided between my seven chil-  
dren, Mary, Betty, Susan, Polly, George and Juliet. And  
each to receive in the distribution for any advancements which  
may have been made to any of them. I consider my son James to

have named more than what would be the portion of my  
estate in my general distribution, I have therefore pretermitted  
his name as above.

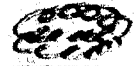
Lastly, I hereby constitute and my sons Aaron and George the execu-

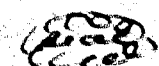
I George James Green do hereby signify the following & publish

In Rappahannock County Court 11<sup>th</sup> of October 1847

This last will and testament of George James Green dec<sup>d</sup> together with the codicil thereto annexed was this day exhibited to the court, proved by the oaths of Joel Butler and William Williams Jr two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

And at a court held for Rappahannock County on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January 1848. This last will and testament of George James Green dec<sup>d</sup> which was admitted to record at October Court last was again this day produced to the court, and on the motion of George M Green and Aaron Green the Executors therein named who made oaths thereto and together with Frances Green, Elizabeth Green, Sarah Green Mary Green Julius A. Green and Hodgman their securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$6000 conditioned as the said direct certificate is granted them for obtaining <sup>a probat</sup> of the said will in due form.
