in January in the year 1845 which is ordered to be certified.
And at a Court held for the said County of Rappahannock on Monday the 8th
day of March 1847. This said last will & testament was again this day produced
to the Court fully proved by the oath of Francis M. Jeffries another of
the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
