At a Court held for Rappahannock County on Monday the 9th
day of October 1843. This last will and testament of John H Wood
dec^d was this day produced to the Court, proved by the oaths of James B
Jones and Henry Miller two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and or-
dered to be recorded. And on the motion of Lucy Wood the Executrix
therein named, who made oath thereto, and together with Middleton
Miller, John Miller, Henry Miller, Benjamin F Miller, Ja^s B Jones
Silas Faison, and Joseph Faison, her securities, entered into and ac-
knowledge a bond, in the penalty of twenty four thousand dollars
conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted her for obtaining a
probate of the said Will in due form

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
