First it is my desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my executor hereinafter named.

Secondly It is my desire that all my perishable property shall be sold
in a credit of six months and also all my personal property shall be

...for cash in a reasonable time after my death.
Thirdly. After the sale of the above property and my just debts of course
expended paid out of the money the balance (if any) left I give unto my
beloved wife forever.

Fourthly. I further wish my beloved wife and son to have a main-
tenance or provision for one year after my death out of my estate.

Fifthly. I do wish my beloved wife Sally Royston to be guardian for
my son William Royston too. He is of age and that she shall not be
required to give security for her guardianship.

Sixthly and lastly. I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Sally Royston my executrix to this my last will and testament and
that the court of Rappahannock County shall not require security
of her for the debts required of this will. In testimony whereof
