

Walden In the name of God: Amen - I Lucy Walden, doth make, declare
and publish this as will, for my last will and testament, My
just debts and funeral expenses being paid, I will unto my son
Carnot M. Walden the following negroes to wit: Meyer, Annan, George
and her seven children to wit: Mary, Elizabeth, Priscilla,
Alinda, Jeffery and Cora, David an old man and Priscilla an
old woman, he my son Carnot paying all demands that are
against the late late estate of Thomas Walden Sen. and I
moreover give, grant, acquit and discharge my son Carnot M.
Walden from all debts dues or demands that I have against
him by virtue of my late husband Thomas Walden's will; and
I further, more give my son Carnot M. Walden the whole of the
household, kitchen furniture that I have in my possession at
Woodville, Rappahannock County Virginia.

My will and desire is, that the negroes in Missouri being eleven
in number as I suppose, however be they more or less, now in
the possession of my son Wm. M. Walden of Missouri, I wish sold,
to create a fund for distribution among my children and grand
children, to wit: to my son Hyatt H. Walden, to my daughter Melinda
Ramy, daughter Eliza Ramy, my grand children, the children of my
daughter Polly Allen, my grand children the children of my son
William M. Walden, and to my grand son William R. Jones the son
of my daughter Lucinda Allen, and the grand children of my
daughter Nancy Allen now Nancy Devins equal shares of the aforesaid
fund.

Rappahannock Co. Virginia Will BK B, 1842-1849 (Wills and Estates)
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now by virtue of my late husband Thomas Walden's will, and
further more from my son Larnah M. Walden the whole of the
household & kitchen furniture that I have in my possession at
Woodville Rappahannock County Virginia.

My will and desire is, that the negroes in Missouri being eleven
in number as I suppose, however be they more or less, come into
the possession of my son Wm M. Walden of Missouri, I wish sold,
to create a fund for distribution among my children and grand
children to wit: to my son Aslett H. Walden, to my daughter Mildred
Camp, daughter Eliza Camp, my grand children, the children of my
daughter Polly Allen, my grand children the children of my son
William M. Walden, and to my grand son William R. Jones the son
of my daughter Lucinda Allen, and the grand children of my
daughter Nancy Allen and Nancy Devine equal shares of the aforesaid
fund created by a sale of the aforesaid negroes, my grand children
receiving the shares or parts per capita of their respective parents
if I had willed it to them instead of their children, making seven
equal shares to divide the aforesaid fund arising from the sale of
the said negroes amongst.

I hereby request and desire that my Executors hereafter named to
pay to my son Aslett H. Walden if he should be bound to my

brother Benjamin Hughes the sum of Five hundred Dollars with
interest on the same, or what ever sum my said son Ashtell H.
Walden may have to pay my brother Benjamin Hughes.

Lastly I give to my son George Walden the remainder of my estate
both real, personal or mixed which I may die seized & possessed
of, which I suppose to amount to about one thousand.

I hereby appoint my son Ashtell H. Walden of Missouri and
Carnot M. Walden of Virginia my executors to this my last
will and testament. Given under my hand and seal this 31st
day of August 1848

Signed, read, published and declared as the last will and testament of Lucy Walden
who signed the same in our presence called

This last will and testament of Lucy Walden dec^d was
this day produced to the Court, proved by the oaths of William

with Benjamin Hughes his security, entered into & acknowledged
