Secondly - I desire that my executors hereafter named out of my estate
pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

Thirdly - I will and bequeath to my beloved sisters Keathurina Ke.
Hollingsworth, Susan A. Powers and Patsy P. Calvert, all undivided
portion of my estate, which may remain (after the payment of
my debts and funeral expenses) equally to be divided among them
and to be enjoyed by them forever.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my brother John S. Calvert
and brother-in-law Samuel Powers Executors of this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all other former wills or testaments
by me made heretofore. In witness whereof I have hereunto set

my hand & affixed my seal this 12th day of August, in the year of our Lord 1845
