

Brown in the name of God, Amen; I William Brown last of
the County of Rappahannock and State of Virginia being sick
and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for
which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human
life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it
has pleased God to bless me with. I give and bequeath the same
in manner following that is to say.

1st I desire that so much of the perishable part of my Estate
be immediately sold after my decease as will be sufficient to
pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

2^{dly} After the payment of my just debts and funeral ^{expenses} I
give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy Brown the use of
my whole estate both real and personal during her natural
life or widowhood but should she marry again she is then to be
put to her thirds as though I had died intestate.

3^{dly} Upon the death of my said wife I give and bequeath to
three of my children to wit Margaret Brown, Frances Brown &
James Brown the tract of land on which I now reside to them
and their heirs forever.

4^{thly} I give and bequeath unto my other five children (to wit)
Percy Brown, Susan Glascock, Lucy Popham, William W Brown
and George Brown my remaining three tracts of land lying in
the County of Rappahannock to be equally divided among them or

my intestate estate with real & personal property (her marriage
life or widowhood, but should as the married person & her estate

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part to her the real as though I had died intestate.

3rd Upon the death of my said wife I gave and bequeathed to three of my children to wit, Margaret Brown, Frances Brown & James Brown the tract of land on which I now reside to them and their heirs forever.

4th I give and bequeath unto my other five children (to wit) Percley Brown, Susan Glascock, Lucy Popham, William W Brown and George Brown my remaining three tracts of land lying in the county of Rappahannock to be equally divided among them or their heirs forever.

getly I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be equally divided among all my children namely: Margaret, Frances, James, Presley, Susan, William H and George & Lucy among them and their heirs forever with this exception that Margaret Brown, Frances Brown and James are to have one bed apiece each. And lastly I constitute and appoint Presley Brown and William H Brown my executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made. witness & verily believe that the said name, thereto subscribed
as a witness, to be written in the hand of the said George Bum-
garner, thereupon this said will is ordered to be recorded.

And on the motion of Presley Brown one of the executors
therein named, who made oath thereto and together with
James Glascock his security (who justified in oath as to his
sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of \$5000 conditioned as the Law directs, certificate
is granted him for obtaining a probate of said will in
due form. Liberty is reserved to the other Ex^{rs} named in

On the motion of Presley Brown one of the executors
therein named who made oath thereto and together with
James Blascocks his security (who justified) with also the
sufficiency entered into and acknowledged bond in the
penalty of \$8000 conditioned as the law directs, certificate
is granted him for obtaining a probat. of will in

the said will to join in the probat when he shall think fit.
