I have In the name of God Amen I have made of the County
of Rappahannock one State of Virginia being much of body
of a certain and respecting myself its hereby made
and take and make this my last will and testament
lawfully making, after in any other or other by me heretofore made
that my will and desire is that my son James Smith shall
have and receive unto him and his heirs as long as
myself and my wife shall live and that all my property
both real and personal to continue and remain as it now
is under his management for his benefit and maintenance
and that he shall be at liberty to receive and keep some
stock for his own life for sustenance
hereby that after the death of myself and wife my property
shall be divided in the following manner that is to say my
son James Smith and my daughter Elizabeth Smith shall
have each one of my estate the sum of one hundred and
fifty dollars each and to my daughter Elizabeth in addition to
the hundred and fifty dollars she is to have a sum of five

equally divided among my children as they are
James Smith, John Smith, Sarah at death wife of John I Smith
John James Smith and Elizabeth Smith wife of John I Smith
she as far as it regards the division of my estate as my
successors and heirs are further my wife as my executor and she in
line John I Smith shall not be compelled to pay any interest
on the money which I have loaned him to him for the
pay for the land on which his now house is other money that
may have loaned him (as I stand) my need of his services as
an accountant in selling matters for him, but the present
debts in these will be taken and accounted for as a part
of my estate.

Truly I hereby constituted and appointed my friend John I Smith
my executor whom I direct from to pay all my just debts
and then divide my estate as heretofore directed
in writing whereof I set my hand this 20th day of January 1851.

tember 1852 John A Smith the Executor named in the last will
and testament of Leath Smith doth which was proved & admitted to
record at October Court last this day came into Court and thence with
himself and together with Charles Smith & John B Parker his executor (who
perhaps on each as to their sufficiency) entered into a recognizance
to have in the sum of \$1000 conditioned as the said Charles B Parker
is granted here for obtaining a probate of said will as will form
