Will. and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory do make
and ordain this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others.
First I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid
by my executors hereinafter mentioned.

Item 1st I give to Sarah C. Smith daughter of Sophia Smith, one negro man
named William, one negro woman named Judy and her infant child named
Daniel, one negro boy named Richard, one bed and furniture, one wooden clock
and one brass kettle.

Item 2nd I give to Silas Daniel, son of Henry Daniel one negro man named
French, one negro woman named Jerusha and one negro girl named Emily.

Item 3rd I give to James H. Browning one negro woman named Zilphie, one
negro woman named Hannah, one negro girl named Mary and one negro
man named Woodson.

Item 4th I give to Amanda Grimeley, wife of Stedman Grimeley, one negro
woman named Mourning.

Item 5th The balance of my property consisting of the land on which I
now reside, my stock of every kind consisting of hogs, cattle, sheep and
horses, my household and kitchen furniture and my farming utensils; I
desire to be sold at public auction at the discretion of my executors herein-
after mentioned and after paying my just debts, the money then remaining
is to be equally divided between Sarah C. Smith, Silas Daniel and James H.
Browning above mentioned.

I do hereby constitute and appoint Turner A. Jones and John S.

Item 3. the balance of my property
now in my stock of every kind consisting of hogs, cattle, sheep,
horses, my household and kitchen furniture and my farming utensils; I
desire to be sold at public auction at the discretion of my executors herein
after mentioned and after paying my just debts, the money then remaining
is to be equally divided between Sarah L. Smith, Silas Daniel, and James B.
Browning above mentioned.

Lastly; I nominate, constitute and appoint James A. Jones and John S.
Hughes Executors to this my last will and testament.
