I give to my son Fountain Woodson the half of the tract of
land upon which his sister's estate which tract of land formerly
belonged to my brother Charles Woodson and contains one hundred
and one acres more or less his half to lay tract off to
him in the sister in which his house now stands to him
and his heirs forever.

I give to my son Washington Woodson the other half of
the above mentioned and described tract of land to be laid
off to him in the sister in which his house now stands to
him and his heirs forever.

I give to my son, Isaac Woodson the tract of land
upon which his sister's estate containing one hundred and one
acres more or less to him and his heirs forever.
