mind and disposing memory do hereby declare this to be my last
will and testament hereby revoking all others previously made.
I have no disposition to alter the interests of my wife or children
in my property, but let it descend as the law directs & I do here
by appoint my friend Jos. Klein my Executor. Given under my
hand & seal this 17th day July 1861

In Rappahannock County East 9th day of September 1861
This last will of Allen L. Dear was this day produced to the
Court sworn by the oaths of Joseph Klein and James E. Werry the
subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
And on the motion of Joseph Klein the Executor named therein
who made oath thereto, and together with James E. Werry
and James H. Werrying the witnesses (who justified on oath as to
their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of \$10,000, conditioned as the law directs. Certificate
is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
of law.
