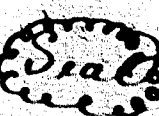
First, It is my will and desire that all my just debts shall first be paid.

2nd. That after all my just debts shall have been paid, it is then my will and desire that all my perishable property purchased by me after the death of my husband or otherwise belonging to me, together with all I may acquire or be entitled to and its increase, not otherwise disposed of by the last will and testament of my beloved husband John D. Browning; such as money, bonds, debts and accounts on hand, due and owing me, all the real and personal estates of whatever kind and description to which I may be legally or equitably entitled at my death, shall go to and be equally and equitably divided among my children, the legal heirs and representatives of my body, share and share alike, to have, own and enjoy forever.

And lastly - I do hereby constitute and appoint Benja. M. Miller and John S. Browning executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
